The Union Finance Minister had announced service tax on hospitals in the union budget. IMA reacted within hours. IMA called it 'misery tax' and compared it to the salt tax of the British Raj. Press conferences were conducted throughout the country and IMA could mobilize the public opinion. Due to IMA's efforts, considerable resistance was created. So much so that the Government was forced to roll back the tax during the budget session itself. The house while congratulating the prompt and adequate action taken by IMA HQ brought to the attention of the National President that Third Party Assurance (TPA) still attracted service tax. The National President replied that TPA and other insurance related issues would be delegated to the to be formed IMA Hospital Board of India.

**Agenda Item No. D-2: Minutes of meeting of IMA Action Committee on BRHC issues**

IMA Central Council meeting held at Hyderabad in December 2009 had resolved to oppose the implementation of BRHC. The National President informed the members that the white paper/memorandums prepared by IMA HQs were submitted to the concerned authorities. Dharnas were organized by IMA HQs at Jantar Mantar and in front of MCI office. Various states/local branches also organized dharnas in their respective States. He also informed the participants that a case has been filed by IMA Kerala State Branch in Kerala High Court and admission was pending in this regard. All India Protest Day was organized on 22.1.11 by various state/local branches of IMA. Young Doctors Association of India was formed under the aegis of IMA. He informed the members that the BRHC proposal has been referred back to the Parliamentary Standing Committee for review and MCI has refused to register the BRHC (Degree) holders in the medical register. A convention was held on 24.4.11 at IMA House, New Delhi to sensitize the Pradhans and Sarpanches of various Gram Panchayats about the ill-effects of BRHC. About 250 representatives of Gram Panchyats participated. IMA presented its objections to the members of Parliamentary Standing Committee on Health on 1<sup>st</sup> July, 2011. He opposed the bridge course proposed to convert the BRHC graduates

into MBBS graduates. He requested the members to donate liberally to IMA Action Fund to meet the legal expenses. The National President expressed his appreciation for the states/local branches who had organized Protest day/Dharnas and also to the Kerala State Branch who had met the Prime Minister of India and apprised him about the BRHC issue. Dr. Vinay Aggarwal requested that local delegations should meet the members of Parliamentary Standing Committee on health as well as Sarpanchs and Pradhans of Gram Panchayats and apprise them about the repercussions of the BRHC.

**Agenda Item No. D-3: Report of Young Doctors' Convention held on Feb.20, 2011 at New Delhi**

The formation of young doctors of India was timely. A students' convention was held on 20/02/11 in New Delhi to discuss the issue faced by young members of the medical fraternity. It was decided to form a national level body under the aegis of IMA. This will comprise of undergraduate and post graduate medical students as well as resident doctors. Two regional conventions in Kolkata and Thiruvananthapuram have followed. Young doctors of India organized protest in front of MCI over the exit test issue. MCI authorities after discussion with the representatives postponed the implementation of exit test. The formation of young doctors association was approved and passed by the house.

**Agenda Item No. D-4: Minutes of the Meeting of IMA Committee on Clinical Establishment issue**

Dr D R Rai HSG presented the status report on Clinical Establishment Act 2010. He said that this act tantamounts to war on the medical profession and is anti people in character. It will increase the healthcare cost. IMA demands to freeze the draft rules. Health care institutions run by single doctors should be exempted from the act. All legislations pertaining to healthcare institutions should be brought under single window for better governance. IMA has submitted its view points to various authorities. Legal opinions have been obtained. A dharna was organized at Jantar, Mantar, New Delhi on 28.06.10. State and Local branches observed protest day on 22.01.11. Two rounds of discussions have been held with DGHS. Dr Sanjoy Banerjee said that some states have accepted the act and were framing the rules. He elaborated on the status of the West Bengal bill. He suggested that IMA should try to modify the rules if it was not possible to stop the act.

The National President elucidated the reasons for the formation of Hospital Board of India. IMA felt that in a country where 87% of healthcare expenditure is outside the Government system it is important to have institutions to give direction to the growth and activity of all players. It is important to moor the industry strongly on the ethics and dynamics of the medical profession. To achieve the political objective of maintaining the benign influence of the medical profession on the healthcare industry IMA has stepped in with the initiative of Hospitals Board of India. IMA will strive to improve the quality of services and ensure better patient safety. Dr Zameer Pasha and Dr R V Asokan elaborated on the new initiative. The draft rules and byelaws of IMA Hospital Board of India was tabled. Dr A Marthanda Pillai suggested that the constitution of state chapters and their affiliation with the HBI should be defined. The House noted the suggestion and approved and passed the draft rules and byelaws of IMA Hospital Board of India. The House approved the nomination of the office bearers for a two year period of 2011 and 2012.

Due to the timely action taken because of the unity of the medical profession, the culprits in Gaya (Bihar) have been brought to book. The U.P. Govt. has suspended and arrested two senior officers of the department. Minister of Family Welfare, U.P. and Minister of Health Services, UP were sacked.

IMA demands a CBI enquiry into the murder of Dr. B P Singh. PIL has been filed in Allahabad High Court demanding CBI enquiry. State-wide protest is being planned. IMA Hq was mandated by the House to take appropriate steps in this issue.

**2) Endosulfan issue:**

Dr. Gopeenathan, Kerala submitted the study report of IMA KSB on the endosulfan issue. The House passed a resolution demanding ban on the use of endosulfan as a fertilizer.

Vote of thanks was proposed by the HSG Dr. D R Rai. The National President Dr. Vinay Aggarwal concluded the meeting.

**Action Taken report on Minutes of the 205<sup>th</sup> meeting of Central Working Committee of IMA held on April 23, 2011 at Delhi-NCR**

The request for an appointment to meet Health, Law and Home Ministers has been sent by IMA HQs. so that we can apprise them about the attacks on doctors and their medical establishments and request them to make a central law for the same. In this regard, reminders have been sent to the concerned authorities also.

The issues related to TPA and other insurances related issues have been forwarded to the newly formed Hospital Board of India for further necessary action and they are doing the same in a good spirit.

A meeting of Sarpanchs and Panchayats was organized on the very next day of the 205<sup>th</sup> CWC meeting of IMA i.e. 24<sup>th</sup> April, 2011 at IMA House which was witnessed by some of our Hon'ble CWC members where the rural population was informed about the ill effects of the BRHC.

On the invitation received the Rajya Sabha Secretariate for appearing before the Department-related Parliamentary Standing Committee on Health & Family Welfare, IMA attended the above said meeting on 1<sup>st</sup> July, 2011 and discussed the issue on BRHC. We represented IMA's view point in this regard and suggested alternative methods for the rural doctors which were appreciated by most of the MPs present.

The reaction of IMA on the news item published in "The Times of India" dated 1<sup>st</sup> November 2011 titled "Azad pushes for 3.5 yr med course", immediately we sent a press release on this issue. BOGs have requested that MCI should not buckle under pressure of Hon'ble Shri Gulam Nabi Azad, Union Health Minister, Govt. of India. This 3.5yr medical course will produce absolutely untrained medical force which is constitutionally wrong.

Mr. Rajshekhar Rao, an eminent advocate, has been contacted for the cases related to Clinical Establishment issues. A case has been filed in the Courts of Chandigarh & Tamil Nadu. The Hon'ble Court of Chandigarh had issued notices to the Central Govt about the same.

As the Board of Governors has been changed, a fresh case has been filed for the MCI affairs.

A letter was issued to all the Hony. State Secretaries

of IMA requesting them to organize State Convention of Young Doctors' Association of India in their respective States.

After the formation of IMA Hospitals Board of India, two meetings have been convened on 28.8.11 at Chennai and 18.9.11 at Coimbatore where some amendments to the Rules and Byelaws have been proposed and future activities have been planned.

After the meeting of the Constitutional Reforms Committee, the proposed amendments have been prepared and sent to the State/Local Branches for their comments. Some State/Branches have sent their comments and IMA is compiling the same is being present in this CWC.

Letters were issued to the Local Branches which were approved by the last CWC and information was sent to the State and Local Branches approving their newly formed branches and the Constitution of local branches approved have been intimated to the concerned branches.

A letter was sent to the Secretary of Pune Branch, IMA to send its Constitutional amendments through the State Secretary, Maharashtra State Branch, IMA for further necessary action.

The misconduct of Dr. K.V. Babu of Kerala was discussed in the Disciplinary Committee which met on 6<sup>th</sup> August, 2011 at IMA House, New Delhi. The decision of the Committee was forwarded to the State Secretary of Kerala State Branch. He was requested to frame the charge sheet against Dr. K V Babu in chronological order so that necessary further action can be taken by IMA HQs.

As per the decision and instructions of the 205<sup>th</sup> Central Working Committee, appointing Election Commission for conducting the election of IMA Haryana State Branch, the Election Commission constituted for the purpose, conducted the Haryana State Election in two phases. The result of the same has been sent to the concerned members.

## Agenda Item No. A-7

### Report of Hony. Secretary General, IMA

Hon'ble National President, Dr. Vinay Aggarwal, National Presidents of IMA, distinguished guests, esteemed senior colleagues, delegates, ladies and gentlemen. I take this opportunity to welcome you at the 86<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Central Council being organized at Bengaluru, Karnataka. I am sure, you all will enjoy a comfortable stay and wonderful hospitality at this CC meeting.

Some of the important activities undertaken by the IMA during the last one year are highlighted in this report.

**Meeting of office bearers of IMA:** Immediately after taking over by National President, IMA, Dr. Vinay Aggarwal, a meeting of office bearers of IMA was held on 23<sup>rd</sup> January, 2011 where a road map for efficient working of the office was discussed. All the office bearers

traveled all the way to attend this meeting and made it a successful one in the interest of better functioning of the Association. The main purpose of this meeting was to inform the office bearers about the various challenging issues which are of concern for the medical fraternity and sought their opinion on the same issues.

The job allocation was assigned to various office bearers for efficient and smooth working. National Vice Presidents were distributed their area geographically by the National President.

**IMA NEWS :** The IMA NEWS has been dispatched regularly. We have tried to give all the necessary and relevant information in it. I am sure, you must have noticed that the format and look and design of the articles of the IMA News has been changed. We are working hard to procure advertisements for the same. I appeal to all of you to come forward and inform about your activities and procure advertisements from hospital/nursing homes for the news bulletin.

**Membership:** As on 1.1.2011 the membership strength of IMA was 1,86,141 and as on 12.12.2011 the membership strength is 2,05,801. There has been an increase of 10.56% over a period of last one year which is a healthy sign for the Association. I. Cards have been dispatched to the concerned members regularly. The maximum number of members enrolled during this year is from Maharashtra & secondly from T.N.

**Finances:** We have cleared all the T.A. Bills related to the 205<sup>th</sup> meeting of Central Working Committee held on April 23, 2011 at Delhi-NCR and State Presidents and Secretaries meeting held on 7<sup>th</sup> August 2011 along with various Standing Committees of IMA. Till date we have received Rs.7,96,600 towards the Action Fund of IMA from different State and Local Branches of IMA.

**Building:** The Green room on the first floor has been converted into IMA Conference Hall with sitting capacity of 60 to 70 people. The renovation of office bearer's rooms on ground floor has been carried out along with renovation of the passage.

The area used for dumping the old stock of IMA at 2<sup>nd</sup> floor, which was known as balcony, is being vacated because Quality Council of India has shown its interest to take this place on rent. The process of negotiation for letting out the space on lease with QCI is on. It has been decided that the two rooms known as International Centre at Ground floor, which are lying vacant for quite a long time, be given on lease. It has also been decided to utilize the unused area or lying vacant on 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> floors.

**IMA Directory:** The directory of any Association is a beneficial tool for its members. Proformas have been sent to the concerned office bearers of IMA with a request to kindly fill their particulars to be printed in the directory. A Proforma was issued to the States/Local Branches requesting them to send the full details of their

Central Working Committee, Central Council Members to IMA Hqs for updating their data and enable IMA HQs to make a directory.

**Dharna at Rajghat :** A Dharna was organized on 22.1.2011 at Rajghat, New Delhi on the issues of suspension of National President & Hony. Secretary General, IMA and show cause notice to 61 office bearers of IMA, Dissolution of MCI, and implementation of Clinical Establishment Bill and introduction of Bachelor of Rural Healthcare which was successfully planned.

**Convention of Medical Students against BRHC –** A historical Convention of Young Doctors/Student and medical doctors was held on the 20.2.2011 at Peyare Lal Bhawan, New Delhi where around 800-1000 young doctors/medical students participated to show their protest on various healthcare issues of Govt. of India.

**Meeting with DGHS:** IMA submitted a Memorandum to the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare and also requested to review the draft and regulations of Clinical Establishment Bill. On request of IMA, the DGHS called a meeting of IMA representatives. The undersigned along with Dr. N Appa Rao, Dr. Yash Sharma, Dr. G.B. Singh and Dr. Krishna Parate met with DGHS and his team on 9.2.11. A power point presentation was shown to them by us. The ill effects of implementation of Clinical Establishment Bill were highlighted point by point. After a long discussion for about 4 hours, DGHS was convinced by our view points. The main contention of IMA was on the issue of emergency and stabilization of the patient. He assured that due consideration will be given to the points raised by IMA at the time of finalizing the rules.

**Protest by Young doctors in front of MCI office, New Delhi against Proposed Exit Test :** The medical profession is passing through a stage of turmoil due to various issues challenging the very existence of the medical community. The MCI has announced the Exit Test for the fresh medical graduates prior to the registration with the Medical Councils, IMA is opposing the same on the grounds that once medical colleges are recognized by Medical Council of India after verifying the infrastructure and faculty at the respective medical colleges. Then why the question mark is being put on the education/training parted to the students of those institutions. It is most unfortunate that today also a student has to give multiple tests right from getting admission in the medical college to the higher studies. In this regard, a Dharna was organized in front of the office of MCI at New Delhi on 29.3.11 which was widely attended by the medical community. On our protest, MCI officials were forced to invite IMA delegation during protest itself. Delegation comprising of Dr. D.R.Rai, Hony. Secretary General, Dr. Vinod Kumar, President and Dr. Anirudh Lochan, Secretary, Young Doctors' Association explained the IMA's view point about Exit Test to the Secretary, MCI and members of Board of Governors, MCI. Dr. R.N. Salhan assured that this will not be started before 2017.

**Service Tax:** The imposition of service tax on the medical establishments and diagnostic services was received with pain by the medical fraternity as declared by the Hon'ble Minister of Finance, Shri Pranab Mukherjee during the budget for this year. According to our National President, Dr. Vinay Aggarwal, a levy of 5% Service Tax on health care industry has hurt the sentiments of the health sector. He was of the opinion that this reminds us of the Salt Tax by the British Empire levied on the poor citizens of the country before Independence. Over and above of this, if service tax is also imposed on the professionals, the poor patient will be further burdened. In view of this we have written a letter to the Prime Minister of India and published an article in the Hindustan Times dated 4<sup>th</sup> March, 2011 and met with various leaders of opposition and the whole issue was resolved and hence the medical profession was exempted from the service tax.

Regarding the Service Tax liability on the membership of IMA, Mr. Ashok Batra, Consultant, Service Tax has been hired to look after the same.

**Convention of Pradhans & Sarpanchs of Gram Panchayat against BRHC:** This Convention was held on 24<sup>th</sup> April, 2011 at New Delhi in which Pradhans & Sarpanchs of Gram Panchayat were informed about the ill effects of BRHC. After a long discussion by various Sarpanchs and Pradhans from different parts of the country, they were of the opinion that they will not accept the half baked doctors for their areas. They will come forward to support the cause of medical fraternity & promised that they will initiate this movement in various rural areas in their respective states. And if it happens, they will join hands with IMA who is opposing the BRHC.

**Round Table Conference of Associations of Medical Specialties of India :** A meeting of the specialist organizations was organized by IMA on 24.7.11 at New Delhi to discuss and evolve a consensus on the issues of BRHC Course, Clinical Establishment Act 2010 and draft rules and violence on doctors and hospitals. It was attended by various different specialist organizations. After a fruitful discussion and deliberation, it was decided to work together to stop the Govt from introducing the BRHC Course and to oppose the clinical establishment act 2010. It was also decided to demand a central act for the safety of the medical fraternity. In this Conference, it was also decided to form a Confederation of association of Medical Specialties of India under the leadership of IMA.

**IMA National Convention of ESI doctors** was held on 26<sup>th</sup> July, 2011 at IMA House, New Delhi with an aim to bring the two largest organizations, IMA & ESIC together to improve the healthcare delivery system of the country in the benefit of the worker class community created by ESIC on which depends the economy of our country.

**Presidents & Hony. State Secretaries Meet** was held on 7<sup>th</sup> August, 2011 at IMA House, New Delhi. States were requested to follow the issues implementation of Bachelor of Rural Healthcare Course, Dissolution of MCI and Clinical Establishment Bill. They were requested to meet their local MPs, MLAs and other concerned authorities.

**A National Workshop for Training to Trainers (ToT) on Tobacco & its medical implications** was organized on 7<sup>th</sup> August, 2011 at IMA House, New in association with Directorate Health Services, Gol. The participants were informed about the formation of IMA National Cancer & Tobacco Cell in IMA.

An International workshop for development of a **Policy statement on Euthanasia and related End of Life Care** Issues in India was organized on 6<sup>th</sup> August, 2011 at New Delhi. After a long brain storming deliberations, the final report of the same will be presented to the Govt.

A two-day **National Workshop on Redefining Medical Ethics** was held on 30<sup>th</sup> & 31<sup>st</sup> July, 2011 at Kochi (Kerala) which is the need of the hour. The important major topics were discussed in this workshop in detail. Eminent social, political, legal and professional luminaries & judicial participated in this workshop.

**IMA Hospital Board of India:** The important wing of IMA which has been started in this year only under the guidance of Dr. Vinay aggarwal, National President, IMA. The issues related to hospitals like insurance could be better addressed through this Board. We should take up the leadership of hospitals and their data-base should be maintained. A meeting of the IMA Hospitals Board of India was successfully organized on 18.9.11 at Coimbatore.

**IMA CGP :** A regional Conference of IMA CGP was organized at Mumbai on 18<sup>th</sup> September, 2011. A study Tour of IMA CGP to Indonesia (Bali) and Singapore from 9<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> October, 2011 was successfully organized. GP CON 2011 along with II international Congress of Family Doctors was organized by IMA CGP on 29<sup>th</sup> & 30<sup>th</sup> October, 2011 at Chennai, which was very well organized.

**IMA CGP:** A Special Convocation Ceremony of IMA CGP was organized on 2<sup>nd</sup> April, 2011 at Azamgarh Branch of IMA in Uttar Pradesh. It was arranged for the candidates who passed their FCGP Examination but could not receive their Fellowship Certificates during the All India Medical Conference in the month of December, 2010 due to the Jat Movement. A short tour to Dubai was organized in the month of February, 2011 with 184 participants

**JIMA:** The office bearers of JIMA are working hard to improve the quality of JIMA and they have brought some new sponsors for their advertisements.

**IMA AMS :** It is observed from the enrollment of IMA AMS Membership during the last two years, most of the State Chapters have not enrolled even a single IMA

Member to IMA AMS. I appeal and request all the Chairmen and Secretaries of IMA State Branches, on behalf of IMA AMS, to cooperate in enrolling more members to IMA AMS fold.

**IMA NSSS:** The scheme shall provide financial assistance to nominee of a member of this scheme in the event of his / her death. **IMA NPPS :** The awareness about the NPPS is getting impetus, I am happy to inform that an MoU has been signed by IMA NPPS and AIOS through which AIOS litigation cases will be dealt by NPPS with their legal cell. I request our leaders' help to propagate the NNPS and give protection to our members from litigations.

**Disaster Management Cell:** Under the able leadership of Dr. Chetan N. Patel, this Cell is progressing very well. A grant of Rs.1,00,000/- (Rupees one lac) has been given to the Orissa State Branch along with some medicines for the victims of flood affected areas in the State. A circular was issued to the State and Local Branch Presidents and Secretaries appealing them to contribute for this cause.

**HSG's representation in Media:** The Hony. Secretary General of IMA was invited by Delhi Doordarshan/Lok Sabha/P-7 Channel and Aaj Tak in the recent months to deliberate on various serious issues faced by medical profession. **IMA GFATM RNTCP PPM RCC PROJECT:** With the sole objective of improving access to the diagnostic and treatment services of DOTS and thereby improving the quality of care for patients suffering from Tuberculosis, IMA's effort has been commendable, in spite of the challenges faced. Since the last report **164** CMEs were held and **6003** PPS were sensitised. **52** DTPs were organised and **1015** PPs were trained. **595** DOT centres have been created along with **11** DMCs.

#### Paper and Printing:

JIMA is being printed in imported newsprint. To change the news print to white printing paper (as suggested from different corners) the cost will be 4-5 times to existing one.

For a large number of publication like JIMA, the cost will be very high. Suggestions are welcome regarding this matter from the Hon'ble members of Central Working Committee.

#### Advertisement and Sponsorships:

We are giving tremendous efforts towards advertisement and sponsorship as well as to increase the rate of old advertisements. there is no marketing in JIMA in last three months of 2010 so we have to regain our positions by our sincere efforts only. We are exploring the alleys of financial support of publishing special issues from the

State Govt. as well as Govt. of India.

### Circulation:

JIMA has two prefix dates from the department of Post and Telegraph of Government of India for despatching, which is 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> of each month. We are keeping on within dates smoothly. So delay in receiving JIMA will be either due to postal delay or faulty addresses.

The number of Return Journals are decreasing day by day. We have given an insertion in April, 2011 issue of JIMA to send us proper and or changed address so that no complaints of non receipt of JIMA comes in future.

Here I also request all the State Representatives to appeal to the State Government to subscribe JIMA for the doctors of the Health Services in their respective States.

It will then reach the doctors in the interior villages and update their knowledge as well as they will know about the activities of IMA on a regular basis. It will also increase the income of the JIMA thereby increasing income of IMA (Hqs).

### Postal Penalty:

It was submitted in the 63<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the General Council of IMA on 19th and 20th July, 2003, at Thiruvananthapuram (Page 109 of Agenda Paper of Central Council) that a sum of Rs.40,00,101.75 (Rupees Forty Lakhs One Hundred One and Paise Seventy Five) only was imposed as penalty on JIMA, by the "Department of Post and Telegraph" for the reason that some pages of JIMA did not carry the page mark as required by the rules. Further developments have been regularly presented to the Finance Standing Committee, CWC, as well as Central Council, from time to time. However after a negotiation a sum of Rs.3,99,893 (Rupees Three Lakhs Ninety-nine thousand Eight Hundred Ninety-Three) only was paid by JIMA. Subsequently a writ petition was filed, in the year 2003, before the Calcutta High Court for waiving of the penalty as there was no such guide line given to JIMA by the Postal Department that all pages will have to be marked. We also reported in the 70<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Central Council that we came to know by a letter from one of the Vigilance Officer of "Department of Post and Telegraph" that, this pending case was dismissed in favour of the Postal Department on the ground that our lawyer had failed to appear before the court on three successions when the case was called for. We met our concerned lawyer and submitted an affidavit in the Calcutta high Court for restoration of the case. We are happy to let you know that the case has been restored in the original file by the Honourable Justice, Soumitra Pal.

### Staff matters:

#### **1) Court case of Mrs. Usha Sengupta**

Mrs. Usha Sengupta, one of the employees of JIMA was terminated from the service w.e.f. 25<sup>th</sup> February, 2005. After that Mrs. Usha Sengupta had filed a case, bearing No. 05/2006,U/S 10(1-B) (d) of Industrial Dispute Act in

the learned Second Labour Court, West Bengal, Kolkata. This particular case was put before the members at (1) 190<sup>th</sup> meeting of CWC at Guntur, (2) 191<sup>th</sup> meeting of CWC at Bangalore (3) 192<sup>th</sup> meeting of CWC at Jaipur (4) 65<sup>th</sup> meeting of Central Council at Bhubaneswar 193<sup>rd</sup> meeting of CWC meeting at Darjeeling, (5) 194<sup>th</sup> meeting of CWC at Ludhiana, (6) 66<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Central Council meeting at Chennai, (7) 195<sup>th</sup> meeting of CWC at Mount Abu (8) 67<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Central Council meeting at Chennai, (9) 195<sup>th</sup> meeting of CWC at Mount Abu (10) 67<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Central Council meeting at Patna, (11) 68<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Central Council meeting at Nagpur, (12) 69<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Central Council meeting at Indore, (13) 70<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Central Council meeting at Hyderabad, (14) 203<sup>rd</sup> meeting of CWC at Mehsana etc.

After many legal hearings the learned Second Labour Court passed an order on 30<sup>th</sup> November, 2009 in favour of Mrs. Usha Sengupta and awarded her, '**She is entitled to get reinstatement in her service with full wages and all incidental benefits including bonus within 60days**'.

Our concerned lawyer received the Court Order on 11<sup>th</sup> February, 2010 and after a consultation with the IMA (Hqs) and our legal Advisor we have submitted an affidavit in the Calcutta High Court. This Writ Petition, bearing the number –W.P.7654 (W) of 2010, was taken up by the Hon'ble Justice Tapan Sen on 09.09.2010. Mrs. Usha Sengupta also moved to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Labour Court of Government of West Bengal claiming an amount of Rupees Seven Lakhs (approx) as incidental charges including the Ex-Gratia (bonus) vide an application under section 33 C (2) of the Industrial Disputes Act and JIMA was directed to appear before the Labour Court on 21.09.2010. In this circumstances at the Calcutta High Court, **Upon hearing the counsel on behalf of JIMA, none for the respondent No.2 (Mrs Usha Sengupta) and on perusal of the Writ Petition the Hon'ble court has been pleased to pass orders staying the impugned award.** The learned court issued a notice to Mrs. Usha Sengupta she is given liberty to file her affidavit-in-opposition by 8<sup>th</sup> November, 2010. This case is listed for hearing on 3.12.2010.

The latest development is that, the Hon'ble High Court of Calcutta has directed to pay Mrs Sengupta the last drawn salary from 9<sup>th</sup> April, 2010 to March, 2011 failing which contempt of court will follow. According to this direction a cheque by salary for the above mentioned period has been given to Mrs. Usha Sengupta amounting to Rs.76,457/- on 08.04.2011.

- (2) We have installed a new electric meter for which deposition of Rs. 45,225/- has been done.
- (3) As promised in the last CWC meeting we have changed newsprint to better quality paper for JIMA

which has caused us a considerable amount every month.

(4) Within last six months there were

- a) Increased of 3% DA which we have to pay arrear from January 2011 and it was given to the staff from April, 2011 onwards.
- b) Increase of 5% HRA from April, 2011.
- c) An ex-gratia to all the staff of JIMA @Rs.6000/- have been given.

(5) Interior Decoration of JIMA has been started.

(6) Even when the journals are not returning to our office some of our respectable members complained of not getting JIMA. We request them to check with their local post offices.

### **Report of Activities of IMA NPPS from January, 2011 to November 2011**

Detailed report of activities for the year 2010 and accounts were presented before the central council meeting held on 27th December 2010 at Jaipur National conference and was passed. Secretary NPPS attended the office bearers meet at New Delhi called by our National President on 22nd & 23rd January 2011. Secretary also attended the Presidents Secretaries Meet held at VITS Hotel Gazhiabad U.P on 19th February 2011 and also participated in the student's convention held at New Delhi in Pyarelal Bhavan on 20th February 2011. Secretary presented a power point presentation about IMA National Professional protection Scheme before the newly elected State Presidents and Secretaries of IMA State Branches. The student's convention was well attended by students of different states. IMA NPPS was conducting Managing Committee Meetings regularly

with available office bearers and district coordinators and lots of suggestions were evolved to revive the Scheme. The activities of the NPPS started with vigor and started enrolling new members in different states with the help of State Presidents and Secretaries. As a part of membership campaign Hon: Secretary visited Assam on July 1st 2011 at Dibrugarh. We could enroll 5 members from Assam on the same day itself and the Assam State secretary promised more.

Dr Alex Franklin Hon. Secretary and Dr.Sreekumar Vasudev Joint Secretary visited IMA Dibrugarh Branch of Assam State to attend the July 1st Doctors day celebrations. In the meeting there was a public debate and Panel discussion - on Medico-legal cases and doctors & the role of media and Judiciary. Dr. Alex Franklin was one among the panelist and was called to present the

topic. Other discussants were one from Press and another from Judiciary. We actively participated in the open forum and expressed our concern about the overt reporting of the press and also about some of the judgments which affect adversely the medical profession. Dr.P.K.Chaudary President of IMA Dibrugarh branch and principal Medical college of Dibrugarh also participated along with members in the discussion. In the meeting senior doctors were honoured and there was a power point presentation on the benefits of joining in National Professional protection Scheme by Dr. Alex Franklin and Joint secretary Dr.Sreekumar Vasudev. We could clear the doubts and convinced the audience, the importance of joining the scheme to protect themselves from all types of litigations during their medical practice. Many members have promised to join and 5 members joined already. Dr. Bimal .K.Sarma, Joint Secretary of Assam IMA, was recommended by the IMA State Assam as State coordinator and was appointed. In the meeting senior doctors were honoured and there was a power point presentation on the benefits of joining in National Professional Protection Scheme by Dr. Alex Franklin and Joint secretary Dr.Sreekumar Vasudev. We could clear the doubts and convinced the audience, the importance of joining the scheme to protect themselves from all types of litigations during their medical practice.

Some States has reciprocated positively regarding the membership drive and special mention to Maharashtra especially Nagpur Branch and State of Assam. Already the N.P.P.S is handling some litigation cases at national level. There are seven litigations and five advocate notices. All cases are handling properly by secretary and by panel of advocates in different states. Number of cases is more in Karnataka and Maharashtra. In other states there were advocate notices only, which were properly answered by the secretary and were dropped by the complainants. We could win one case from south of Karnataka in the consumer court in July 2011- a case of Nephrectomy.

Awareness about the necessity of joining in NPPS is getting momentum and enquiries are coming from different parts of the country. Now the total membership has increased to 425 and I hope our members will utilise NPPS and will join the scheme. I request our leaders' help to propagate the NNPS and give protection to our members from litigations.

IMA NPPS and AIOS have come to an understanding for the conduction of AIOS litigation cases in collaboration with their legal cell. Hereafter all the litigation cases of AIOS will be dealt with IMA NPPS. I have to thank our National President Dr.Vinay Aggarwal for signing the memorandum of understanding with AIOS at New Delhi on 22/10/2011. Secretary General Dr. Rai, Dr.Ashok Grover National President of Ophthalmic Society, Dr Lalith Verma Secretary AIOS, Dr. Harbansh Lal Hon Treasurer AIOS, and Dr. Alex Franklin Secretary NPPS also signed the document. Dr. N.S.D Raju President Elect AIOS and other dignitaries of AIOS witnessed the ceremony

We have five litigation cases on trial and seven advocate notices from different states. All of them are managing well by the Secretary. Maximum cases are from Mangalore (Karnataka) and Maharashtra states, one from Himachal Pradesh and one from UP. I am proud to announce that we could win one consumer case from south Karnataka (Litigation against a case of Nephrectomy). There is another case in National Consumer Forum for a compensation of 10 crores against Ultrasonologist in Maharashtra. Another criminal case is pending at Mangalore alleging negligence in the management of PET complicating pregnancy. In every case we could give moral support to the member and dealing the cases effectively.

During this week Memorandum will be given to the President of India, Governors ,Chief Ministers and Local administration of all the states against Quackery. Public awareness campaigns will be initiated.Public debates, painting competitions in schools, Rallies, Dharna, Hunger strike etc will be organised at the local level.

Activities taken up by IMA headquarter recently:

-In the capital Delhi Medical Association has filed a PIL in Delhi High court requesting hon. High Court to pass an order asking Ayurvedic and homeopathic persons not to

use allopathic drugs which is a violation of Supreme court judgment. This has been accepted and hearings are going on.

-IMA HQs.has become a party to a PIL in Supreme court where quacks of Tamilnadu filed a case to allow them the practice but the Court refused to do so and has started further proceedings in this regard.

-In Delhi on the complaints of IMA HQs., Delhi Medical Council , Delhi Police and Delhi Govt. has started taking action against quacks. Recently few clinics have been closed and few quacks have been put behind the bar. More than 200 such clinics have been closed by DMC.

IMA opposes prefixing of "Dr" by physiotherapists.

IMA is also fighting against the chemists who are selling drugs without prescription of a qualified allopathic doctor.

### Report of IMA HQs. Media Centre

#### **IMA WELL PRESENTED BY THE MEDIA AS A RESULT OF BETTER RELATIONS AND BETTER LIAISON OF THE IMA MEDIA SECTION WITH THE MEDIA**

The Media Centre of IMA HQs., which was inaugurated on 24th March, 2007 at IMA House, I.P. Marg, New Delhi has been one of the most active divisions of IMA since the taking over of the current team of office bearers.

We have been making our views public on all healthcare related issues on a literally day-to-day basis.

The Media Centre of IMA HQs. has been burning midnight oil ensuring better coverage of IMA activities and its viewpoints on various issues being faced by the Association and the medical profession.

It is one of the most active departments of IMA since the taking over of the current team of office bearers.

National President Dr Vinay Aggarwal & Dr. D.R.Rai, Hony Secretary General, IMA has appeared on various national channels deliberating on the various burning and relevant issues related to the medical profession. Dr.D.R.Rai has deliberated upon the issues vehemently on popular national channels like Lok Sabha, P7 News and Doordarshan on not less than 5 occasions. Both have been extremely successful in putting forth the issues and viewpoints of IMA and the medical profession in front of the whole nation.

The Media gave due coverage to all the above events in all the major dailies as displayed elsewhere in this issue of the IMA News. The Section is receiving reports of wide national coverage of all the events organized by various branches of IMA all over the nation.

In accordance with the request of National President, Dr. Vinay Aggarwal as mentioned in his Presidential Address at the time of installation, the IMA HQs. Media section issued a request to all State Branches of IMA to set up a State Media Centre in their offices. We have received enthusiastic responses from our State Branches on this and hope to observe better liaison of IMA and its State Branches with the Media.

A Press Conference was held immediately after an All India Young Doctors' Convention which was organised on the issue of Bachelor of Rural Health Course (BRHC) at Pearey Lal Bhawan, New Delhi on 20-2-2011. Both the convention and the press conference were a grand success. Dr.Vinay Aggarwal, National President and Dr. D.R.Rai, Hony. Secretary General, IMA addressed the Media. Dr.Narender Saini who was nominated as the IMA Nominee to Young Doctors' Association (YDAI - formed under the aegis of Indian Medical Association) also addressed the Media alongwith some Student leaders. The movement for Disaster Management was started by then our National President Dr. Ajay Kumar and Hon. Joint Secretary Dr. Dharam Prakash. The IMA HQ Disaster Management Cell formerly formed in the year 2007. The cell has following nine members with National President and Hon. Secretary General as ex-officio members. Dr. Chetan N. Patel (Chairman), Dr. Dharam Prakash (Convener), Dr. Ajay Kumar, Dr. Ajoy Kumar Singh, Dr. V. U. Seethi, Dr. K. Vijaya Kumar, Dr. Vijay Punjabi, Dr. Upendra Kumar, Dr. A. Selvarajan. Every year 1/3 members will retire by rotation. They are eligible for re-appoint by CWC. The 1<sup>st</sup> National Workshop was organized at Vadodara. During the inauguration function then National President Dr. Ajay Kumar released IMA HQ DMC logo. Uptill now total 10 meetings of the cell were held at the site of CWC and proper line of action was decided. As per the decision taken in the meeting, a manual of Disaster Management is prepared and was released during IMACON 2007 at Nagpur. The manual is very informative including the list of all members of state & local branch DMC. The manual has been sent to all the state & local Disaster Management Cell members.

A meeting of Disaster Management Cell was held on 24<sup>th</sup> April 2011 at Ghaziabad. The progress was reviewed. As per decision, a separate e-mail account has been opened. Awareness & certificate programme for IMA members have been finalized. The detail report of the meeting is given elsewhere in the Agenda Papers.

During this year 10<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Cell was held on 19<sup>th</sup> November 2011 at Chandigarh. Hony. Secretary General, Dr. D.R.Rai adorned the National President, IMA Dr. Vinay Aggarwal with the Presidential Medallion.

The meeting was called to order by National President, IMA. It was followed by a Silent prayer. The flag salutation was read out by Dr. D.R. Rai, Hony. Secretary General, IMA.

Dr. Vinay Aggarwal, National President, IMA, welcomed Dr.G.K. Ramachandrappa, National President-Elect, Dr. Mahesh Sharma, Chairman, IMA Standing for Aao Gaon Chalen and other members. He informed the members that he had presented a detailed report on the Project titled “Aao Gaon Chalen” in C.W.C. meeting at Bangkok and it took shape in the Central Council Meeting at Bhubaneshwar. He stressed importance of the programme which was started in 2004 and as a result of that 360 villages were benefited. He remarked that this programme should not only remain a slogan but become a model for the future. He also briefed about the work done in this regard by IMA State Branches of

Kerala, AP, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Gujarat, UP, Rajasthan, Haryana and Delhi. He also said that being a National President, IMA, he wants to reform this project further to make it more meaningful.

He then requested Dr. Mahesh Sharma, Chairman, IMA Standing Committee for Aao Gaon Chalen, to address the house.

Dr. Mahesh Sharma, Chairman, Aao Gaon Chalen, welcomed all the members and shared his experience and briefed his view point on this project. He explained the importance of this programme. He described it as a bridge between the society and doctors which will improve trust between common man and doctors, something that is slowly eroding between the two. He assured the members of making this programme really effective programme and requested to all IMA Branches to adopt at least one village and take care of their healthcare, hygiene, sanitation, vaccination, preventive health checkup programme etc. He contributed a sum of Rs.1 Lakh for this programme.

National President, IMA requested Dr. G.K. Ramachandrappa to present his vision on the project. Dr. G.K. Ramachandrappa greeted all the members and shared his vision of working in villages and adopting a village for their overall growth of village which will include improvement in their water supply, drainage system etc. He has collected about Rs.27 lakhs from public and Karnataka Government for this purpose. He named Dr. Sudhir Shah as an example who is working in this field and feels pleasure serving people. For this effort Dr. Shah has been bestowed with Padam Shree Award. He also informed that Karnataka Chief Minister announced separate budget for health projects. He offered the services and complete dedication of the State to any programme a dedicated team of doctors and very good committed leaders are required to take up this task. He suggested that every medical college should adopt at least 5 villages and we should organize a meeting of the Chairpersons of all Medical Colleges for this purpose.

Members suggested to include the following in the Aao Gaon Chalen Project.

1. In this project, Pulse Polio programme may be organized with planning to circulate of one lack tablets to poor people.
2. DOTS Project.
3. Members suggested to take up the women’s health at priority as still it is neglected one. They felt that the States should take up the Aao Gaon Chalen programme including women’s health.
4. It was also felt that each local branch should adopt one village. Gram Panchayats should be involved for

the continuance and sustainability of this programme, common structured programme is required and awareness programme is extremely important for such endeavors..

5. Obtain complimentary medicines from the pharmaceutical companies and send them to the villages.
6. IMA should coordinate with the Govt. for the project.
7. The importance of general awareness about Good Hygeine as an integral part of the Aao Gaon Chalen Project was stressed upon.
8. It was also felt that the pharmaceutical companies can be roped in for free medicines to be exclusively used for rural population under the Aao Gaon Chalen Project.

It was finally decided that a high level working group may be formed at the IMA HQs. to prepare a road map for this Project and the proposals may be presented before the CWC at its next meting.

The Hony. Secretary General authorized to take necessary action in this regard at the earliest.

1. Fresh literature for the project may be produced by the HQs.
2. A special meeting of State Presidents and Secretaries may be called as a ToT Workshop for sensitize them and inform them about this project covering health related issues and community activities.
3. Compilation of reports of activities already completed may be done at the earliest.
4. We should dedicate 2 pages of IMA News for Aao Gaon Chalen Project.
5. One or two programme should be organized all over the country at the zonal levels.
6. Possibility of tie up with business groups may be explored.

Dr. D.R. Rai, Hony. Secretary General, IMA said that the heart of India lies in the villages. Dedication & sustainability of the project is a factor which is essential for promotion of Aao Gaon Chalen Project.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

With the help and support of Hon'ble National President, Dr. Vinay Aggarwal, the entire cost of treatment was considerably reduced. He personally followed up his case during the surgery and recovery of Mr. Hari Om. The contribution of our National President, Dr. Vinay Aggarwal, has been extremely humane.

Dr. D.R.Rai, Hony. Secretary General welcomed the National President, Dr. Vinay Aggarwal, Immediate Past National President, Dr. G. Samaram and National President Elect (2010-11), Dr. G. K. Ramachandrapa to the dias. National President was adorned with the Presidential Medallion and the meeting was called to order after silent prayer and flag salutation..

Dr. Vinay Aggarwal, National President, IMA in his inaugural address, said that it is an important meeting of the IMA leadership. He dedicated this meeting to the visionary, fighter and leader - Dr. Ketan Desai, Past National President, IMA who has been struggling on various issues. He informed the members that on the issues of Dissolution of MCI, implementation of Clinical Establishment Act 2010 and introduction of Bachelor of Rural Healthcare Course by MCI, a Dharna was organized by the State/Local Branches of IMA on 22<sup>nd</sup> January, 2011 all over the country. IMA has been receiving tremendous response from its States and Local Branches. He informed that Govt. of India has taken a decision to introduce the BRHC Course and Dr. Gulam Nabi Azad, Union Health Minister has decided to start it at the earliest. IMA is opposing implementation of this Course tooth and nail. While addressing the issue of Dissolution of MCI, National President informed the members that a case has been filed by IMA in the Delhi High Court regarding the re-constitution of MCI on 18.2.2011.

He also informed the House about the historical Convention of Young Doctors/Student and medical doctors to be held on the next day of this meeting i.e. 20.2.2011 at Peyare Lal Bhawan, New Delhi where around 800-1000 young doctors/medical students are expected to participate to show their protest on various healthcare issues of Govt. of India.

He also stressed that a Hospital Board of India should be constituted under the aegis of Indian Medical Association.

He requested all the States to invite the respective National Vice Presidents who incharge of their States.

He requested the House to guide/assist how to move forward on these issues. He expected the support of IMA leadership on all issues ranging from intellectual issues to financial issues.

He appealed to the States to work hard and be united to keep the IMA flag flying high.

Dr. D.R.Rai, presented the report of activities of IMA HQs through a PP Presentation. He informed the members about the issues related to the suspension of National President & Hony. Secretary General, IMA, issuance of show cause notice to 61 office bearers of IMA, Dissolution of MCI, implementation of Clinical Establishment Bill, introduction of Bachelor of Rural Healthcare, Essential Services Maintenance Act on medical professionals and Pre-registration exit test for medical graduates. Members were informed that a Stay has been obtained from Delhi High Court and A.P. High Court on the issue on suspension of NP & HSG of IMA respectively.

Members were informed that a Special Committee was formed to deal with issues related to dissolution of MCI consisting of Dr. V.C.V. Pillai, Dr.Ajay Kumar and Dr. S.N.P. Singh. He also informed that an earlier White Paper prepared by IMA on MCI is being updated by Dr.Ajay

Kumar and Dr.Ved Prakash Mishra.

On the issue of introduction of Bachelor of Rural Healthcare (BRHC) (3½ Years') Course by MoHFW, Govt. of India members were informed about Dharna in front of the office of MCI, a delegation of IMA HQs and Kerala State Branch leaders met Shri P.C.Chacko, Member of Parliament from Kerala for his intervention. A case was filed by Kerala State Branch in Kerala High Court for which the admission is pending and a case is being filed by Tamil Nadu State Branch in Chennai High Court. The HSG informed that wide coverage is being received including lead stories in Print and Electronics Media.

Members were apprised about the reports and photographs of State Dharnas organized by different states on 22.1.2010 in their respective states.

They were informed that IMA HQs organized a Dharna on 22.1.2011 at Rajghat, New Delhi on the above mentioned issues.

The House was informed about the meeting of a delegation of Kerala IMA members with Hon'ble Prime Minister of India on the issue of BRHC. It was informed by the Kerala members that Prime Minister of India gave his assurance to intervene on this issue. The House placed on record the hard work done by the members and leaders of IMA Kerala State branch to raise the voice of IMA in front of the Prime Minister of India.

Regarding the Clinical Establishment Bill 2010 which was notified on August 19, 2010, office bearers were informed that a meeting of a Special Committee for Clinical Establishment Bill was organized on 13<sup>th</sup> January, 2011 to discuss the issue. A representation was sent on this issue to Secretary, Health & Family Welfare and other officials concerned.

The House was informed that a delegation of IMA HQs led by Dr. N. Appa Rao met the officials of MoHFW and apprised them about the shortcomings and ill-effects of C.E.A.

While discussing the issue of Health Insurance, IMA HQs feels that there is no transparency in the mediclaim policies. IMA HQs contacted various T.P.As & insurance companies and still trying to contact Insurance Regulatory & Development Authority (IRDA).

He appealed the members to contribute generously in the Action Fund of IMA to meet the legal expenses of the challenging issues of IMA

He requested the State leaders to arrange funds for various activities, identify the source of projects and work hard for the contribution towards IMA Action Fund.

The National President requested the House to give their comments on the above mentioned issues and the following suggestions came out from the discussion:

- All state leaders should meet their local MPs/

MLAs. They can also meet the Editors of Local Papers of their respective states. These issues have to be filed in the Court of Law from all over the country. IMA leadership has to be more active and vigilant. IMA should function as a professional body.

- Some members were of the opinion that instead of meeting local MPs/MLAs and Shri Gulam Nabi Azad, we should meet Prime Minister of India, Shri Manmohan Singh, Chairman, UPA, Smt. Sonia Gandhi, and Shri Rahul Gandhi so as to make them aware about the real scenario of these issues.
- To rejuvenate the Aao Gaon Chalen Project. IMA should once again chalk out the plan and submit the same to Gol.
- Start Rural Medical Colleges in place of Rural Medical Schools in rural areas.
- National Rural Health Commission should concentrate in improving the infrastructure in health & education.
- Right to health should be given constitutionally.
- Other Specialist Organizations should be contacted.
- Healthcare should be declared as infrastructure industry.
- IMA should involve Human Rights Commission, Panchyat Leaders & various social leaders of the community and sensitize them about the BRHC Course.
- The whole Clinical Establishment Act/Rules should be displayed on the website of IMA HQs. It should be circulated to the Leaders of the States for wider circulation.
- Jr. Doctors should be given some incentive while they become members of IMA.
- IMA should force State Govts. To start appointments in their respective states.
- Some members suggested that sustained and prolonged agitation is the only way to achieve our goal.
- Sensitization of all MPs/MLAs preferably Doctors MPs, should be contacted.
- Meet the Editors of Vernacular Press Agencies and apprise them about the issues of IMA.
- To involve Sr. Members of the profession who have been awarded various National Awards like Padamshree, Padam Bhushan etc. for their contribution to the medico-social fields so as to send a good message among the masses.

A meeting of the IMA Standing Committee for Medical Education held on Sunday, the 13<sup>th</sup> March, 2011 at 4.00 P.M. at IMA House, I.P.Marg, New Delhi-110 002.

The IMA Standing Committee for Medical Education discussed the following issues :-

1. Vision-2010 on Medical Education
2. Bringing the Medical Education under the Human Resource Department regarding the medical curriculum, the committee unanimously opposed the reduction of the period of the MBBS Course (from four and a half plus one to four plus one). The Committee felt that the increase in research and knowledge explosion and newer development in the medical field reduction in the course of MBBS will be counter productive. The committee welcomed changes in the syllabus and curriculum to meet the needs of the present day basic doctor.
3. The committee felt that the common entrance examination need not be implemented before standardisation of plus two education. There are various streams of secondary education like CBSE, ICSE and SSLC syllabus. Until there is a common syllabus the common entrance examination will adversely affect students taking certain courses.
4. The committee also felt that a common Exit Examination is also unnecessary. The Medical Council of India is supposed to supervise common minimum standard in medical education. If that responsibility

of MCI fulfilled there is no need for common Exit Examination.

5. The committee strongly recommended restoration of the Medical Council of India with all its powers and autonomy, maintaining its statutory character
6. Entrusting the responsibility of medical education, maintenance of its standards can not be entrusted to a body which contains mainly non-medical experts.
7. Recommendations of the Committee :
  1. The committee requested all the State Branches of IMA to have a discussion with medical Universities/other Universities of the States and to request them to object to the revised MBBS curriculum.
  2. The committee also decided to request all State Branches of IMA to conduct a workshop on medical education inviting senior medical professionals.
  3. It also decided to ask the medical students to debate the revised medical curriculum and to give suggestions/recommendations on it to IMA Headquarters.
  4. The IMA (HQs.) will conduct an one day workshop on medical education inviting health professionals, academicians, health activists and IMA Leaders.
  5. The committee decided that the proceedings of the workshop should be presented to all parliamentarians, members of the Health Standing Committee, Union Health Minister, DGHS and the Medical Council of India.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

Medical Ethics is an integral part of Medical Practice. Ethics refers to the rules which regulate human behaviour. Ethics is linked to morality, which refers to beliefs about right and wrong, good and evil that guide our behaviour. The basic code of Medical Ethics is the 'Hippocratic Oath' of 400 BC, which has been accepted as the basic principle by the World Medical Association as the 'Declaration of Geneva' and by the Medical Council of India as the 'Code of Medical Ethics' which is the guiding moral principle for all Medical Practitioners in India. But in the past many years lot of drastic changes occurred to the practice of Medicine as also the legal definitions regarding the Medical Practice. The good old Family Doctor concept has given way to multi-specialty corporate hospital set up and the thinking and attitude of the common man and the society in general has also changed a lot regarding Medical Treatment. Again the method of Patient management has thoroughly changed with the advent of costly modern diagnostic modalities. Again when the Medical Profession was dragged into the ambit of CPA, the Profession is legally branded as a trade !!

Considering all these changes in the Social Scenerio, the Indian Medical Association National Head Quarters conducted a Two days workshop on "Redefining Medical Ethics" at IMA House, Cochin on 30th and 31st July, organized by IMA Kerala State. Seven major topics were discussed in detail in the Workshop.

- Session I : Organ Transplantation with special reference to Kidney Transplantation.
- Session II : Doctor and Pharmaceutical Companies, Referral fee and Commission Practice.
- Session III : CPA and Medical Profession; Rights & privileges of Doctors and Patients and Professional Confidentiality.

### **Report of International Workshop for development of a Policy statement on Euthanasia and related End of Life Care issues in India**

In a recent judgement in the case of Aruna Shanbaug, the Supreme Court of India has made Passive Euthanasia permissible under Indian law. Due to this Judgement, the subject of Physician Assisted Suicide (PAS) and Voluntary Euthanasia (VE) has been brought into public debate in India. The debate highlights the concern of the society regarding the last phase of life immediately prior to death.

The recent advances in End of Life Care (EOLC) have given rise to previously unrecognized moral and ethical conflicts regarding initiation of Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) in patients whose lifespan has been prolonged at the cost of their quality of life (QOL) without adding real hope of recovery

Indian Medical Association (IMA), in association with University College of Medical Sciences (UCMS) organized an “**International Workshop for development of a Policy statement on Euthanasia and**

**related End of Life Care issues in India**” on August 6, 2011 at Multi Purpose Hall, India International Center, New Delhi.

After brain storming pre workshop meetings held at IMA House and UCMS office, a consensus was reached that the following End of Life Care Issues needed high level deliberations and discussions in today's scenario:-

- Withdrawing/withholding life support treatment or Passive Euthanasia – Withdrawing/ withholding life support treatment
- Issues in Legalization of Euthanasia or End of Life Policy for India
- Macroeconomics of invasive medical technology in terminally ill
- Applicability of Advance Directives and Living Wills in India and
- Physician Assisted Suicide and Active Euthanasia

All the intricate details of the organization of the workshop like the venue, agenda, speakers, delegates and finances were carefully chalked out. Extreme attention was imparted to the selection of participants for the group discussions. The Joint Organising Secretaries and their offices burnt their midnight oil and hand picked each and every delegate with extreme precision. The choice of International speakers for the plenary session was done keeping their expertise on this matter in consideration.

The workshop was attended by more than 130 delegates consisting of leaders of IMA, participants from medical colleges across the country, prominent personalities from Judiciary, media (print and electronic) and social activists who have congregated on one platform considering it their moral duty to arrive at consensus guidelines relevant and applicable to Indian scenario through the process of focus group discussion.

The Workshop started right on time as per the Agenda. Dr. Vinay Aggarwal, National President, IMA welcomed the delegates and requested them to ponder over the question whether we are ready for Euthanasia or not. Dr. O.P.Kalra, Principal, U.C.M.S. and Workshop Chairman, informed the members present how the idea of holding the workshop materialized.

After a formal welcome, the plenary session started with Dr. Frances Norwood delivering a lecture on Withdrawing / Withholding life support versus Physician Assisted Suicide. Dr. Norwood is an Assistant Research Professor/Professorial Lecturer at Anthropology Department, George Washington University, Washington DC. The Chairpersons during her session were Dr. Tri Budi Rahardjo and Dr. Fiona Stewart. Her presentation on the topic was absolutely articulate and impressive.

Then Dr. Robert Young of Melbourne, Australia was requested to deliver an address on “ Economics of long term life support – time for advance directives”. Dr. Young, who is presently serving as a Reader in the School of Communication, Arts, and Critical Enquiry at La Trobe University, Melbourne, explained the financial, economical, sentimental and behavioral aspects connected to the life support systems in cases of terminal illnesses which gives rise to the need of advance directives in such cases so as to bring about a uniformity in decision making and eliminate chances of misuse of the provisions of Euthanasia related laws. Dr. K.T.S. Tulsani and Dr. Harmala Gupta, Chairpersons for this session raised some points on this issue which were addresses to everybody's satisfaction by Dr. Young.

After this thought provoking session, Philip Nitschke, the Founder & Director of Exit International, a leading Voluntary Euthanasia & end-of-life choices information / advocacy organization of Australia, took up the issue of effective Legalization of Euthanasia. He touched the correct strings by pointing out the various legal aspects involved in Euthanasia and the shortcomings liable to be faced by us in our quest. He shared the experiences of his practice in his country and kept the audience spell bound on various intricacies related to the issue. Dr. Pinky Virani and Dr. N.K. Mohanty who had kindly consented to be the Chairpersons for this session, too expressed their admiration for Dr. Nitschke on the expert handling of the complex issues related to the topic and said that his experience will be a guiding source for us to formulate the law and relevant policy in our country.

The Plenary session was followed by the Inaugural Session. Dr. G.K. Sharma, Asst. Director General of Health Service, Govt. of India had kindly was the Chief Guest at the inaugural session. Dr. R.K. Grover, Director, Delhi State Cancer Institute was the Guest of Honor. They shared the Dais with Dr. Vinay Aggarwal, National President, IMA, Dr. O.P. Kalra, Principal, UCMS, Dr. S. Rajpal, Medical Supdt., GTB Hospital, Dr. D.R. Rai, Hony. Secretary General, IMA, Joint Organising Secretaries, Dr. Narender Saini, Hony. Joint Secretary, IMA & Dr. Ashish Goel, Professor in U.C.M.S. and Dr. Amitesh Aggarwal. Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Sharma, Chief Guest and Dr. Grover, Guest of Honour expressed their complete hope from the organizers about the outcome of the workshop and pledged their complete support. Dr. Vinay Aggarwal welcomed them and promised the esteemed Guests that we will do our best to bring out the most relevant outcomes from this workshop. Dr. Rai, proposed the vote of thanks and said that the recommendations of the workshop will help in making the Policy Statement of IMA most useful.

After this, the participants were divided into 5 groups and per the topics above under a Chairman, Moderator and Rapporteur for each group. All the Groups discussed and deliberated upon the list of questions given to them by the organizers and added a few more on the spot. The final report of the discussions will be prepared shortly and presented to the Govt.

The workshop ended after the presentations of the recommendations of the above 5 groups by their leaders.

**REPORT ON THE ISSUE OF PROPOSED IMPOSITION OF  
SERVICE TAX ON MEDICAL PROFESSION**

The Union Finance Minister, Mr. Pranab Mukherjee, had proposed imposition of Service Tax on the medical profession in his General Budget for the year 2011-12. IMA reacted immediately on the issue. The National President, Dr. Vinay Aggarwal wrote a letter to the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, Sh. Manmohan Singhji requesting him to reconsider the decision of the Finance Minister and ensure its rollback. Some members too wrote to the Prime Minister and the Finance Ministry in this regard. *(The matter of a reply from the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare to a letter from Dr.S.Arul Rhaj, Past National President, IMA written in this regard to the Prime Minister's Office is reproduced below.)*

An advertisement was also published in the major national dailies equating this step with the "Salt Tax" of the British government and requesting the Hon'ble prime Minister to kindly take necessary action as requested by

us. A Press Release was also issued in this regard to make the general masses aware of the impact of this proposed draconian step. The national, State and local branch leadership was informed about all these activities on a regular basis and requested to take similar action at their end also. As a result of all these activities of IMA, the Govt. was forced to rollback its proposal of imposition of Service Tax on the medical services in the Budget session itself.

It was a big victory of our unity. We organised a press conference in this regard and also thanked the Hon'ble Prime Minister for his acceptance of our request. Communications were sent to the leadership of IMA informing and thanking them for their support.

**Matter of a reply from the Min.of Health & F.W. to a letter from Dr.S.Arul Rhaj, Past National President, IMA to the Prime Minister's Office regarding his views on the Health Budget, 2011**

The undersigned is directed to refer to your e-mail dated 14.02.2011 addressed to Prime Minister's Office regarding views on Health Budget 2011. Your suggestions have been noted and the views of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare are as under-

- i) The Govt. is aware of the need to increase allocation to health sector for providing affordable health care to the population. In this connection, Govt, of India has launched the flagship programme of National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) in 2005 for providing affordable and accessible health care in rural areas. An amount of Rs. 99491 crore has been allocated by the Government of India for the health sector during Eleventh Plan period (i.e. 2007-08 to 2011-12) as compared to Rs.42799 crore during the Tenth Plan.
- ii) Government is taking steps for developing Secondary and Tertiary health care. Under NRHM, funds are

provided under State PIP for upgradation of infrastructure of district hospitals/ hospital\* above CMC level. Under Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY), Government is in the process of setting up 8 AIIMS like medical institutions as well as upgradation of 19 medical colleges in the country.

iii) Ministry of Health & Family Welfare has recommended the case to the Ministry of Finance for according the 'infrastructure' status to the Healthcare industry. In this connection, Finance Minister has recently announced that Government of India will soon provide a framework for Viability Gap Funding for creation of physical infrastructure in health and education through public-private partnership (PPP). The modalities are being worked out.

iv) As far as Right to Health is concerned, the discussions are taking place at various fora.

#### MR. SUNIL GAVASKAR, THE FAMOUS CRICKETER CONSENTS TO BE THE IMA BRAND AMBASSADOR FOR THIS INITIATIVE AND UNVEILS IMA POSTER ON "SAVE THE GIRL CHILD" ON 16-10-2011 AT NEW DELHI

Indian Medical Association (IMA) is highly concerned about the declining female ratio in the society. In this regard, IMA has been organizing various activities under the programme "Save the Girl Child" for the

past more than a decade. Girl child is a nations' pride 'How sad, many girls missing from our country, are found buried in some graveyard....

Indian Medical Association is involved in the mission of "Save the Girl child" since last 5 years and has organized many workshops, meetings of the community and religious leaders in this respect. IMA strongly believes that the future of our generation lies in saving the girl child by preventing the female foeticide and infanticide.

Traditions and rituals outline the existence of the Indian girl child. Although there are uproars of gender equality and the law of land, female infants are still found dumped in trash, while unborn fetuses continue to be killed in the womb. Wrought with discrimination and prejudiced by rituals, our society has dealt the girl child a rough hand, starting even before birth, till the dark of life

This social evil is deep rooted in Indian ethos and the most shocking fact is that the innovative and hard high end technologies are brutally killing the Indian girl child. Innovative techniques, like ultrasound, scan tests and amniocentesis, devised to detect genetic abnormalities, are highly misused by number of families to detect gender of the unborn child. These clinical tests are highly contributing to the rise in genocide of the unborn girl child. Since the late 1970s when the technology for sex determination first came into being, sex selective abortion has unleashed a saga of horror. Many of the experts are calling it "sanitised barbarism". Although foetal sex determination and sex selection is a criminal offence in India, the practice is rampant and is followed by female foeticide. Demographic trends indicate India is fast heading towards a million female fetuses aborted each year. If the 1991 Census showed that two districts had a child sex ratio (number of girls per thousand boys) less than 850; by 2001 it was 51 districts. India's child sex ratio continues to plummet, indicating that female foeticide and infanticide remain rampant. Provisional data released by the census office for 2011 shows that the child sex ratio (0-6 years) has further declined to 914 girls for every 1,000 boys as compared to 927 in 2001. The divide between the north and south has got even starker with J&K's child sex ratio falling precipitously to 859, making it the third worst state after Haryana and Punjab. In 2001, J&K had a better child sex ratio than the Indian average. With the exception of Himachal Pradesh, no state in the north now has a child sex ratio above 900. Haryana (830) and Punjab (846) remain at the bottom of the table, but have improved over 2001. Punjab is the most improved state with a 48-point increase over 2001, while Haryana has 11 more girls per 1,000 boys than it did in 2001.

IMA in its mission has requested the legendary Cricketer Mr Sunil Gavaskar to join in this endeavour for saving the girl child and he has accepted the IMA's call.

Mr. Sunil Gavaskar, eminent Cricketer, social activist and a well known celebrity has given his consent to be the "IMA Brand Ambassador" on the issue "Save the Girl Child". He has shown keen interest to be a part of the IMA initiative on "Save the Girl Child" as its Brand Ambassador.

At a function organized by IMA in New Delhi to introduce Sh. Sunil Gavaskar as its Brand Ambassador and to unveil a poster on this IMA initiative, Sh. Gavaskar said that he was glad to know that the doctors of the country have been conscious about their obligation to the Child Sex ratio of the country and are dedicated to bring this aspect of the population in order through its dedicated members. However, he expressed his anxiousness on the slow pace of the desired results in this regard. He said that the society has to bring a change in their thinking. He further said that I will do my best and will work with IMA in this initiative.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr.D.R.Rai, Hony. Secretary General, IMA informed that under the programme, IMA has been organizing workshops, seminars and lectures for different sections of the society on the importance of the Girl Child. Besides this, IMA had organized general awareness rallies at prominent places of all cities all over India including Rajpath in New Delhi etc. In addition to this, IMA organized a Meet of religious leaders of all the religions to get this peril condemned directly by the highest seats of every religion. All these activities have been a tremendous success. Dr. Rai however said that it is unfortunate that in spite of our efforts, the Girl Child is still missing, either on account of female foeticide or neglecting a Girl Child.

Addressing the gathering and the Media, Dr. Narender Saini, Hony. Joint Secretary, IMA informed that under the ensuing programme, a signature campaign has been planned by IMA in which we intend to get signatures of more than one lakh doctors and 20 lakhs members of the society before the "Doctors' Day" next year, i.e. 1<sup>st</sup> July, 2012 taking a Pledge to "Save the Girl Child".

Sunil Gavaskar said that seeing the intensity of the initiative of the members of the doctor community he was absolutely sure that this menace of discrimination with the Girl Child will be a thing of history in the coming future as the doctors enjoy the highest esteem in the community and the voice of the doctor is still like the voice of God to most of the citizens of our country.

Dr. Rai promised everybody present that the doctor community will take all steps necessary to root out this evil from the society at all costs.

### **REPORT OF PARTICIPATION OF IMA IN VARIOUS MEETINGS AND EVENTS RELATED TO HEALTH**

**Meeting with Population Council** it was held at India Habitat Centre where various high level faculty was there, to discuss the effectivity, mode of action & repeated use of ECP as emergency contraceptive and ultimately it was concluded that use of ECP should be promoted to avoid unwanted pregnancies but the client should be counselled to use regular contraceptive.

Another meeting was held at India Habitat Centre with **Plan India** where the discussion was **on declining sex ratio.** Various sector were invited to discuss the issue and how to reverse this ratio & why it has failed.

Ultimately all non medical groups and those medical persons involved in PCPNDT Act, directly or indirectly were of the view that. Ultra Sound clinic should be monitored & strict

action should be taken against the people involved authorities who are not taking action against such establishment, should be punished for non compliance of the action.

Another meeting of **STI Technical Working Group of NACO** which was held for two days. The only important aspect came out after the meeting that we must sensitize the doctors for identifying the STDs & related complication & target group who are exposed to such disease & HIV, Condoms should be made available to them. One more important issue came that in centre where STDs & HIVs are being detected & treated, they should treat other diseases as well so that the group which is exposed to these infection. Can freely get treatment for other ailments as well without

any difficulty? It was also discussed in the meeting that feasibility and effectiveness of saturated training of private providers for STI/RTI and view on whether NACO should negotiate, as a National Policy with Medical Council of India to consider training as part of CME activity and link the same with periodic renewal of licences. It was also noted that reporting of STDs & HIV should be more proper and quickly.

**17<sup>th</sup> meeting of Central Supervisory Board of PCPNDT** attended on 4.6.2011 at Vigyan Bhawan. There was lots of deliberation & discussion, why sex ratio is still going down in spite of PCPNDT act is enforce since 1996. Mix consensus was that many ultra sound clinics are not registered. Many ultra sound clinics are mobile clinics who are probably

involved in sex selection. Form 'F' which is mandatory to be filled for all ultra sound related with pregnant lady is not done truthfully. Department of Health & Family Welfare is not doing proper medical audit of Form 'F'. Proposed restriction of one radiologist to have registration at various clinic. Govt. should ask manufactures & suppliers of ultra sound machine to provide the data of second hand machines taken back in buy back schemes. There was a discussion on who is authorized to do ultra sound – thus it was decided that any MBBS doctor trained for ultra sound should be allowed – then MCI was given the responsibility to decide who & where this training should be given.

### REPORT OF "EXPERIENCE SHARING SEMINAR ON MATERNAL AND CHILD ANEMIA"

The National Institute of Health and Family Welfare (NIHFW), an apex institute of MOHFW, GOI in collaboration with A2Z & the USAID organized a One-day "Experience sharing Seminar on maternal and child anemia" under the USAID Micronutrient project on 25th May 2011 in New Delhi.

The aims of this workshop were to bring together technical experts and stake holders to understand the magnitude and issues related to maternal and child anemia, measures taken to control them by central

and state governments and limitations and potentials in these efforts.

The undersigned was deputed by Dr. Vinay Aggarwal, National President, IMA to attend the same.

I attended this workshop. The workshop shared the efforts made by A2Z, the USAID Micronutrient project and the results obtained and lessons learnt. The views of the undersigned during the Question Answer sessions were appreciated by everybody and well

taken. The workshop also came out with recommendations that are practical, doable and more focused on effective reduction on prevalence of anemia.

Strategies to control malnutrition specially of micro-nutrients were looked into in depth alongwith the as-

essment of the impact of inventions in community. Involvement of NGOs and local community into these interventions was deliberated at length. The most important issue was related to the interventions in schools and coverage of the adolescent girls.

### Report of IMA representation in the meeting of National Technical Advisory Group on Immunization

The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India constituted the National Technical Advisory Group for Immunization (NTAGI) in August of 2001. The Secretary to the Government, Department of Family Welfare, is the chairman of this committee, and the Assistant Commissioner, Immunization Program is its Member Secretary.

The undersigned recently attended a meeting of the NTAGI. The meeting discussed on the Control of the Polio cases. It was informed that no new polio cases has been reported in India and even from the areas of UP and Bihar. The Committee was satisfied with the progress in the Polio Control. It was told that the Govt. of India is using bivalent polio vaccine with

appropriate potency. The surveillance of the polio virus (P1,P2,P3) is continuously being done to assess the need of the vaccine. The post polio control scenario was also discussed and the need of good water and sanitation was highlighted. The committee stressed on the overall control measures in addition to vaccine. IEAG (India Expert Advisory Group) told all the participants from all the States that at present the Govt. of India is not planning to give injectible polio vaccine (IPV) to control polio and they will continue with the oral vaccines only.

### **Report of the CMAAO Ad-hoc Committee Meeting on Task Shifting and Strategy for Continuous Development of Medical Practice held from 2-4 March, 2011 at Tokyo (Japan)**

A meeting of the CMAAO Ad-hoc Committee Meeting on Task Shifting and Strategy for Continuous Development of Medical Practice was attended by the undersigned from March 2-4 at Tokyo, Japan. A thorough deliberations were done by the members present during the meeting about the recommendations received from WMA, WHO and also CMAAO on the issue of Task Shifting and its applications.

The need of Task Shifting was started late back in 2003 from Sub-Sahara countries where number of HIV/AIDs patients increased to the fold of 40% and there was a shortage of medical professional who can take care of these patients.

On the same lines, few countries started thinking of shifting the responsibility of qualified persons to the less qualified person taking the excuse of man power shortage.

IMA's view point was well taken when the undersigned explained to the audience that there is no man power shortage in our country and we are bound by the Constitution which does not permit us to allow the nurses/pharmacists to write medical prescriptions. If we allow the same, it will be just encouraging the quackery

and we will have to change our Constitution also, which is not possible. As far as minor services like I/V Line, dressing, counseling of the patient is concerned, it can be taken up as our country is already having a DOT Programme.

After lot of deliberations the following recommendations were suggested:

1. The nomenclature of "Task shifting" should be changed to "Task Delegation". Under any circumstances, patient safety should not be compromised.
2. Even in the case of task shifting for addressing workforce shortage, transferring of tasks should be restricted to skill-related practices and should not be extended to knowledge-intensive practices such as diagnosis and prescription. It must be acknowledged that a health worker who is not fully trained as a medical practitioner cannot bring the full range of scientifically based skills to patient care.
3. Government should not depend on task shifting for longer term even in the emergency or inevitable situations where otherwise it means no treatment at all for patients due to critical shortage of medical

- workforce. Task shifting is only a tentative alternative to a shortage of medical workforce and it should be implemented with a clear exit strategy.
4. Task shifting cannot be globally applied at the same level and (or) standard. Task shifting should take community-specific approaches respecting each community's underlying situations and meeting each local context.
  5. In the interest of patient safety and quality of care, task shifting approach should be focused on addressing medical workforce shortage rather than merely substituting less trained health practitioners for fully trained health practitioners.
  6. Government should not view task shifting as a cost saving measure, Government should make every effort to establish fully functioning health care system based on stable provision of skilled medical workforces.
  7. NMAs should assess effectiveness of task shifting applied for specific instance and monitor the whole

process of application for it can serve for the right purposes.

8. Strategies for recruitment and retention of medical workforces are important pillars of fully functioning health care system. Along with education and training programs for recruitment, government and NMAs should develop policies for retention including strategies on physician migration and positive practice environment for physicians.
9. Implementation of universal coverage of health care would be the best way to enhance access to medical services and strengthen the health care system. Government and NMAs of CMAAO region should share knowledge and experience of achieving universal coverage and help each other to build up this capacity.

They mentioned that India is having serious problem due to wide spread of tobacco chewing and intake of Gutka which contains high percentage of tobacco. The Council also discussed about suggesting to the world authority that smoking in presence of children and pregnant women should also be banned.

The Council expressed its concern about growing influence of pharmaceutical industry on the medical profession which is creating serious ethical problems. It was decided that WMA should soon lay down the guidelines for the physicians of the world regarding their relationship with the pharmaceutical industry.

NCDs cause 70-80% of health burden in commonwealth. Youngsters are more affected by NCD.

Four top prioritized NCDs are Diabetes, Cancer, CVD and Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease.

They have four shared risk factors as **smoking, unhealthy diet, physical inactivity & harmful use of alcohol**

Many scientific presentation were made by Researches and Clinical experts in NCD highlighting the magnitude of the problem today & tomorrow

The chair CHPA Dr. S. Arulhaji., MD.,FRCP., made a presentation on prevention of NCD & role of controlling alcohol use in youth

After a daylong discussion it was decided to engage all the stake holders 111 commonwealth for effectively controlling & prevention of NCDs

The CHMM theme for 2012 was debuted & finalized as “Linkages between NCD & communicable diseases – synergies and successes”

On the eve of CHMM, CHPA executives met & decided to support all the commonwealth Health Associations to effectively address the health issues of commonwealth.

### Doctors Preventing Heart Disease in India

The incidence of coronary heart disease (CHD) is estimated by the Centre for Chronic Disease Control in New Delhi to reach 64 million by 2015 compared with 27 million in 2000. Mortality from CHD is estimated to rise to 10 million people from the current 3.4 million. One third of mortality rates due to non-communicable disease is attributed to CHD.

In India, CHD is starting to occur in individuals below the age of 40 years, as well as in women. This is thought to be due to the increasing incidence of obesity, hypertension, diabetes. The Centre for Chronic Disease Control (CCDC) is a New Delhi based not for profit research organization of health professionals and social scientists engaged in knowledge generation and knowledge translation for the prevention and control

of non communicable diseases in various settings in developing countries (<http://www.ccdcindia.org/>). The CCDC also acts as the scientific secretariat for the Initiative for Cardiovascular Health Research in Developing Countries. The Indian Medical Association aims to reduce the incidence of Coronary Artery Disease to less than 1 per cent in the general population through health education in the local media in local languages; group discussions; screening camps for diabetes, hypertension and coronary heart disease; and providing after 50 coronary risk health checks in workplaces, factories and government offices.

After detailed discussion regarding the misconduct of Dr. K.V Babu, it was unanimously decided to frame the charge sheet in a chronological order. Once the file is

ready, legal opinion must be taken for misconduct and indiscipline as per the Constitutional provisions of IMA HQs. Looking to the gravity of the case, every body opined that effective steps must be taken against a member for gross indiscipline.

Dr. N Appa Rao was empowered to discuss the matter with legal adviser and act accordingly.
