I learned through the 223 CWC that IMA HQRS Building has been renovated.

Members were thinking that the renovation could have costed only few Lakhs

When I went through the Finance Standing Committee minutes it has costed beyond 6 crores.

Huge fund has been taken from Corpus Funds. IMA funds are deficient by 6.5 crores as on date.

Let the prime office bearers answer the following

- 1. Who permitted to start the Renovation work?
- 2. What was the estimated expenses? Who gave the estimate and which CWC approved it? Any Competitive Quotes received?
- 3. Source of funds? If it is from IMA Corpus, Central Council with focused agenda with unanimous approval can only authorize you. Otherwise not possible. Who will pay back?
- 4. Still lot of work is pending. How we are going to complete?
- 5. 6 crores is a very high amount. We can buy a new Building itself. Agenda on finances is enclosed.

Many accounts were not clear. Para Medical, Schemes, wings & End TB accounts also are not in order. Clarifications are needed. My sincere suggestion will be, to call for a FSC on the evening of 27th December.

We did not have FSC prior to 223 CWC too & also this whole year.

Hope members will understand.

DOCUMENTING ANTI ASSOCIATION ACTIVITY:

The following e mail purported to be written by one Dr B Rama Rao from KAKKINADA has been sent to many members. The content of the mail are contrary to facts.

- 1. The expenditure on the building is spread over two years.
- 2. The building was in a bad shape. Concrete material from the roof had started falling in some places. Many aspects of the building including the compound wall, terrace, electrical installations, generators etc required thorough overhaul. The sewerage was non existent. There were structural challenges as well. These facts have been documented in all meetings including the CWC and Central Council.
- 3. Proper mandate to proceed with all repairs and renovations from the building and finance committees as well as their approval from CWC and Central Council are there in 2019 and 2020.
- 4. Due process has been followed within the limitations of force majure imposed by the Covid pandemic.
- 5. A third party audit of the expenses was performed and the report is part of the agenda papers of CWC and Central Council.
- 6. Finance committee meeting was conducted this year on 13.10.2020
- 7. Loan from internal funds of the association, which is the standard practice for several years without liquidating any corpus fund or resorting to external bank loans has been utilised to perform the much needed repairs and renovations.
- 8. Accordingly value addition to the fixed assets have been created.
- 9. The above said mail has been circulated amongst members with malafide intention of creating confusion, conflict and hatred amongst the members of the association by spreading false information.
- 10. There exists no such member in the membership register of IMA. Another member with a name partially similar has denied any knowledge. He is neither a central council member nor a CWC member.

As such the above mail circulated in the name of a nonexistent member with malafide intention of creating confusion, conflict and hatred amongst members of the association with false information is documented here as anti association activity. The same is taken into cognition and be proceeded accordingly.

The company has also been courteous enough to restart the whole system once again without charging anything.

Report of IMA HQs. Building at New Delhi

Report of IMA Building at New Delhi by Dr Vijay Kumar Malhotra, Hony. Joint. Secretary, (Building)

I am thankful to National President, IMA, Dr Santanu Sen, and Hony. Secretary General, IMA, Dr R. V. Asokan for having bestowed their faith in my abilities and assigning the responsibility of maintenance of the IMA Building, Cafeteria and Guest House at New Delhi.

It is to be brought to your kind notice that following activities point wise have either already been completed or are in the process of being completed.

- The AMC for Pest Control has already been given for five years and the required payments made.
- 20 New Tata Sky Cable connections have already been installed including 5 primary +
 15 secondary connections in addition to the already existing four connections (1 Primary
 + 3 secondary). Required payments have already been made after following the due
 procedure.
- 3. The statue of Dr A K N Sinha has been repaired and fixed at the first Floor
- 4. The area vacated by ARTH has been completely cleaned and made presentable. Advertisement in newspapers has already been given regarding renting it out. A hoarding has also been installed in front of the IMA Building for the same purpose.
- 5. The mini auditorium (AKN Sinha Auditorium) has been completely white washed, painted and polished and already in use now. The 14 burnt up chairs of the same auditorium have been repaired and refurbished.
- 6. There were around 100 chairs lying outside the premises of IMA Building either to be condemned or to be reused if possible. Out of them approx. 75 chairs have been repaired, polished and refurnished to be used again in the IMA premises for meeting purposes. Rest of the material that is lying here is in the rapid process of being condemned as soon

as possible.

- 7. The AMC for our existing fire fight system which was lying unused for the last one year has also been finalized and it has been decided to give AMC to the company which had originally installed it. The company has also been courteous enough to restart the whole system once again withoutcharging anything.
- 8 The AMC for genset which was also pending for the last one year has also been given to "M/s
 - Rediant Power Engineers and the due payments have already been made in this regard.
- 9 A large deep freezer and cold drink refrigerator which were lying faulty and unused in the canteenhave also been completely repaired and are being used now.
- 10 A lot of items as required have also been purchased for use in the cafeteria. The microoven hasalso been repaired.
- 11. The entire exterior wall of the building has been rid off all the vegetations and wild plantgrowths.
- 12 The rooms of HSG, HFS and Jt Secretaries have also been white washed and painted as perrequirement.
 - 13 The Quotations also have received for sound system to be installed in mini auditorium and arebeing finalized and due payments shall be made within 3 4 working days.
- 14 A number of serial meetings are being regularly held with architect and other relevant vendors to finalize and initiate the working of rehabilitation of IMA Building alongwith the mural painting of Dr B C Roy on the external façade of the building and for National Flag Pole Installation.
- 15 It has been also kept in mind that entire sewage system of IMA including the old caste iron sewage pipes, sewage shafts, manholes need to be overhauled immediately. Main electrical panel and electric cable system of the whole of the IMA building needs to be immediately renewed.
- 16 The drawing plans in auto cad have already been made of IMA Building and the concerned engineers have been contacted to look after the structured safety of IMA building for any furtherrenovation or addition of floor in the Building.
- 17 The external boundary wall all around the building of IMA is being planned to be raised to the level of stairs landing platform and properly covered for safety purposes.
- 18 The IGL Piped Natural Gas (PNG) authority has also been contacted for installation of PNG Connection in IMA building at the earliest for which the required amount has already been paid to the concerned authority 2 – 3 years ago and we are hopefull that it will be installed within a span of 2-3 months.
- 19 We have also received a liability notice of Rs. 65,59,077/- towards the property tax of IMA Building to be paid alongwith its penalty from SDMC. A visit to the office of SDMC is also being planned with Dr V K Monga, Chairman, IMA HBI and Property Tax consultant to amicably resolvethis issue

The amendment notification dated 19.11.2020 has not even spared and has included the field and discipline of Oro-Dentistry for permitting such surgeries as well to those who do not hold any requisite qualification for that purpose. They have also prescribed several procedures of Modern surgery as their own. It is extremely shocking for any registered medical practitioner holding recognized and valid modern medicine qualifications in observing that such catastrophic decisions are being taken right under the nose and the vigilant eyes of the National Medical Commission (NMC) - who is the watchdog for not permitting any such illegal and ill-advised adventure and is in a state of inertia.

It is pertinent to point out that CCIM existed during the days of the erstwhile Medical Council of India as well. They had never dared to do such a thing. Not only did they amend their Regulations to undertake this harakiri, they had the audacity to argue all modern developments have universal ownership. What is in a name? This is their poser after plagiarising a long list of modern surgery. AYUSH students will hereafter be entitled to learn modern surgery euphemistically called Salya Thanthra alias General Surgery. AYUSH graduates will be entitled to independently practise surgery. The remarkable silence of NMC, to say the least, is mind-boggling and is entirely inexplicable. NMC is demonstrating its self-inflicted helplessness as an upside-down sea turtle being dissected ventrally.

You, Sir - being a veteran eminent Professor of ENT [Retd. from AIIMS] who spent a significant part of his life practising the very same surgical discipline, would perhaps be the best person to understand and gauge the mood of your fraternity, colleagues / peers at the institutions where you worked in the ENT and other Departments of medicine. Had it not been done by a Government statutory body it would have been booked under IPC. Nothing less. What is astonishing is the absolute silence and inaction from your goodself as a person and as an institution. Sir, may we point out that the august office you occupy is out of the blood and sweat of Modern Medicine doctors. A lesser person would have been uncomfortable in this awkward moment.

Medicine had always been a calling. It has always been a passion. Now we understand part of it could be for sale or trade off. Now we understand it bequeaths blood money as well. Thousands of Indian Doctors trained and baptised by MCI populate several National Health services bringing soft power to India. India remains a global destination for medical care thanks to the professionals and peers of medicine in the MCI and when majority of them were elected by the fraternity and had no subjugation of the Government in power. On the contrary, NMC in its virgin year of existence has betrayed the trust of generations of doctors. Medicine is an independent profession asserting its autonomy. It cannot be led by His Master's voice.

Even at this late hour if NMC could stand up for the long-standing values of the profession of medicine, the situation could still be saved. IMA TO NMC

02.12.2020 New Delhi

To, Dr. Suresh Chandra Sharma Chairman, National Medical Commission

The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India on the recommendations of Board of Governors of Central Council for Indian Medicine have issued a Gazette Notification dated 19th November, 2020 as an amendment to the Postgraduate Regulations notified earlier.

By the said notification the Postgraduate Courses namely MS Shalya Tantra, in the nomenclature thereto the words (General Surgery) have been incorporated along with the nomenclature. For the said course the competencies have been prescribed which amongst other things entails certain competencies which squarely fall under the ambit, authority and jurisdiction of modern medicine. The said competencies falling under the ambit of modern medicine have been prescribed by the then Medical Council of India as the competencies ascribable to the postgraduate course titled MS (General Surgery). Likewise, in the said Notification the MS (Shalya Trantra), the ambit of the coverage of subjects thereunder have been purported in the notification cumulatively bracketing them as (Diseases of Eye, Ear, Nose, Throat, Head, Oro-dentistry).

Even the competencies which have been catalogued in the Notification, there are competencies which squarely fall under the ambit of modern medicine specially with reference to those incorporated for postgraduate speciality courses in MS (ENT) and MS (Ophth).

It is submitted that, the settled legal position by a series of judgments of the Hon'ble Supreme court of India makes it clear that, the different legally recognized Medical Councils, namely the Indian Medical Council under the Indian Medical Council Act 1956, now replaced by the National Medical Commission Act 2019, the Indian system of medicine covered by the Indian Medicine Central Council Act 1970, the Homeopathic system of Medicine covered by the Homeopathy Central Council Act 1974 are separate councils for the respective different systems of medicines, covered by the said respective different statutes. It is also held in these judgments that, the Councils for the respective different systems of medicines cannot be permitted to override or intrude into the other either in the practice of medicine or in the medical education amendment notification dated 19.11.2020 has not even spared and has included the field and discipline of Oro-Dentistry for permitting such surgeries as well to those who do not hold any requisite qualification for that purpose. They have also prescribed several procedures of Modern surgery as their own. It is extremely shocking for any registered medical practitioner holding recognized and valid modern medicine qualifications in observing that such catastrophic decisions are being taken transgressing the purview of National Medical Commission (NMC) - who is the watchdog for not permitting any such illegal and ill-advised adventure.

AYUSH students will hereafter be entitled to learn modern surgery euphemistically called Salya Thanthra alias General Surgery. AYUSH graduates will be entitled to independently practise surgery.

It is also well settled in law and by precedents pronounced by the Supreme Court and various High Court that, medical councils recognized by the law, namely the Indian Medical Council now replaced by the National Medical Commission, the Central Council of Indian Medicine and the Homeopathic Central Council, cannot issue notifications, circulars or guidelines beyond the purview of the respective medicines as defined under the respective acts.

Central Council of Indian Medicines has no authority to prescribe training or practice of surgery in any form of modern medical practice unilaterally and suo motu in their syllabus, curriculum and regulations without consulting with National medical commission. Training in surgical procedures is imparted to the students of modern medicine as a continuation and culmination of their course-long study on modern medicine, anatomy and pharmacology, physiology, and many other subjects based on scientifically proved principles of modern medicine. Traditional knowledge can be accepted only after scientific validation. More over surgical procedures require administration of anesthesia, antibiotics and many other medications. There should be appropriate knowledge in management of complications. It will be hazardous to public health and safety, and for any Modern

www.ima-india.org 163 Medicine doctor to indulge in such a name-sake training would be unethical as violative of the rules of ethics of modern medicine prescribed by the Medical Council of India.

For the aforesaid reasons, it can be reasonably suspected that, the Notification referred above is issued only for permitting the procedures of modern medicine under the Indian Medical Council Act 1956 now replaced by the National Medical Commission Act 2019, to be applied to the patients under the name of Ayurvedic procedures and medicines, against the provisions of law and the precedents laid down by the Supreme Court of India and the various High Courts of India.

Therefore, it is submitted that, the amendment referred above to the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations 2016 made by the Central Council of Indian Medicine in exercise of the powers conferred by clause(i), (j) and (k) of sub section(1) of section 36 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act 1970 (48 of 1970) (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations 2016 vide Notification of the Central Council of Indian Medicine bearing No: F.No:4-90/2018-P.G. Regulation Ayurveda dated 19th November 2020 published in the Extra ordinary Gazette of India part 3 section 4 dated 20.11.2020, be annulled.

IMA expects NMC to fulfill its legitimate duty to defend its jurisdiction and authority. These expectations are reflected from the entire medical fraternity of the nation. We also demand of NMC to articulate its views with clarity in public and take a stand on the well settled legal position. IMA is of the opinion that to pacify the anger and frustration amongst the modern medicine doctors and the student community as well as to strengthen the hands of NMC in INDIAN MEDICAL ASSOCIATION (HQs.) As you are aware a student of modern medicine goes through a grilling process of NEET to get into a PG Course of MS. When he/she comes out as a surgeon he/she is subjected to the oversight of code of medical ethics as well as the legal liability of Consumer Protection Act.

If this development goes unchallenged a day will come when modern medicine medical colleges will be deserted for an easier access through the colleges of Ayurveda. That will mark the end of the Era of Modern Medicine the legacy of which will be inherited by the NMC.

We appeal to you to take appropriate urgent steps to mitigate the situation.

Dear Sir, We appreciate the quality time provided for discussing the current situation of the profession. Your candid remarks that NMC was not consulted before the amendment of CCIM on PG In Ayurveda surgery and that NMC has legal limitations in responding are a matter of record. However, IMA would want to put forward the viewpoint that there is a constitutional obligation and duty entailed on the National Medical Commission to put forward its legitimate opinion in appropriate forums as well as to the public and the fraternity. As a matter of fact, the profession is looking for clues regarding the stance of the Commission.

IMA again reiterates that an emergency meeting of the full commission and the Advisory Council should be called for. This could provide valuable input and perspectives from eminent persons of the profession from across the country. As a matter of fact, this could provide clues to defuse the crisis in a way acceptable to the doctors and students of modern medicine. The credibility of the voice of NMC will only be strengthened by adopting the correct route of official consultations and consensus approach by the Chairman. The burden of responsibility would be equally shared between all the members. In the absence of a minuted official meeting the posterity is likely to judge NMC to have slipped into arbitrariness. History could be harsh on all of us who remain stakeholders to the crisis. Future generations of doctors beholden us for their destiny.

On the other hand an uniform opinion of the Commission and the Council will stand as a beacon in these dark hours. It would send right advice and message to the Government. The Government deserves unadulterated opinion of the Commission in determining the fate of the profession. To that extent calling for the meeting of the Commission and the Council is a national duty bounden on the Chairman. This would also help to pacify the agitated doctors and students as well as help the Government also to find a way out of the current difficult situation. IMA once again exhorts and demands that an emergency meeting of the Commission and the Council be convened and the emerging crisis defused.

We are constrained to draw your attention to the public statement made by the Chairman Board of Governors of Central Council for Indian Medicine which has appeared in a section of media to the effect that 95% of Intensive care units of modern medicine hospitals are manned by the graduates of the Ayurvedic Medicine. This statement made by a responsible functionary of the Government of India is not only misleading but is palpably false and frivolous as well.

In this connection we would like to place on record that Medical Council of India earlier ever since its inception and now National Medical Commission in terms of the powers, authority and jurisdiction vested statutorily with them have been carrying out inspections of various medical colleges and the teaching hospitals there at for the purposes of starting of a new medical college, renewal, recognition thereto and periodic renewal of recognition. The same process of inspection is required to be caused for starting of a postgraduate course and renewal of recognition thereto including the augmentation of the intake capacity towards the same.

The inspection records and decisions thereon are there with the Medical Council of India and now National Medical Commission by rechristened name. The said records will bear out that till date in all these inspections not even a single graduate or postgraduate with Ayurvedic or Homeopathic qualification has been permitted to function in any of the ĪCU's. Leave aside ICU's such a personnel is barred by law which is upheld by the regulatory body for medical education in any Department in its entire entourage. The said records are in the custody of the National Medical Commission, which bring out the falsehood of the statement that has been publicly made with unpardonable audacity by the Chairman Board of Governors of the CCIM without having the respect to the said records which are voluminously speaking. It is for this reason your goodself as the Chairman of the NMC and being a custodian of the said records needs to publicly clarify the said position in the interest of setting the record straight and bringing out the factual position to the knowledge and notice of people at large so that there is no scope left for any gullibility of any type.

We also deem it necessary to bring to your knowledge and notice that National Board of Examination as a statutory created authority for Postgraduate Medical Education in country in non-teaching hospitals also has similar rules in operation and their records also go to testimonies the same and thereby bring the utter falsehood of the statement made by the President Board of Governors of CCIM. As Chairman of the National Medical Commission you are Ex-officio member of the National Board of Examinations and therefore, I request you to urge him as well to make a similar statement on behalf of the National Board of Examinations to bring the factual, real, correct and appropriate position to the knowledge of all concerned in the interest of medical profession, professionals and institutions alike.

We are sure taking into consideration the gravity of the situation diligent and urgent steps from your side as the Chairman of National Medical Commission would clear the air and bring clarity to the situation.

We understand that Dental Council of India has taken a stand that the notification by CCIM regarding Ayurvedic Postgraduate surgery so far as the dental procedures are concerned is not in conformity with DCI Act. The same has been circulated amongst DCI members so as to advise the Government accordingly. DCI has also decided to write to Ayush Ministry to align their notification in conformity with the DCI Act. We appreciate the correct and timely stand taken by DCI in the interest of Dentist fraternity under the same limitations of being a statutory body.

IMA has written to you more than once on behalf of the medical fraternity and met you as well to call for a meeting of NMC and its advisory council. It remains important to seek the views of the esteemed members of NMC and the advisory council to place on record and to advise the Government of the non conformity of the said notification with NMC Act. NMC is perfectly within its jurisdiction to take the legally tenable stand and write to the Ayush Ministry asking for conformity with NMC Act.

Defending the jurisdiction and authority of Modern Medicine is important to defend the practice of all modern medicine doctors and the study of our students. By not responding to the notification even in this minimal way NMC is forfeiting its right as the statutory body of modern medicine. It is also failing in its constitutional duty or even the reason to exist. It will not be surprising if the Government in its wisdom decides in few years to repeal NMC Act to form a single council blurring the lines of identity and mix all systems into one. The importance of reacting now need not be overemphasised. We again warn NMC that the judgement by posterity on its failure will become its legacy. A body created to define modern medicine and its education failing in its ordained national duty letting down the fraternity and its students cannot justify its stoics silence and impermissible inaction.

We once again put it upto you to break this inertia and assert your authority and jurisdiction by calling the meeting of members of NMC and writing to the Government and the Ayush Ministry regarding views/consensus emerged during the discussion which in all probabilities shall be the non conformity of the said notification and if so recommend remedial measures.

We carry the trust and the mandate of the fraternity and the students to reiterate these views.
